CAPITOL LOBBY MODEL R. R. TRAIN
INSPIRED BY CURRENT ATTRACTION

Model reproductions of the ancient locomotive and cars that figure in Paramount's "Last Train From Gun Hill," have been put on display for patrons in the lobby of the Capitol Theatre where the Western drama starring Kirk Douglas, Anthony Quinn, Carolyn Jones and Earl Holliman is the current attraction.

Contributed by the A. C. Gilbert Co., the electricallyoperated miniature train traverses scaled-down badlands terrain
copied from actual location settings in "Last Train From Gun Hill,"
a Hal Wallis production.

Adding further to the realism of the lobby display are toy figures of Indians in position to attack the moving train.

The Gilbert toy manufacturing firm, of New Haven, Conn., was invited by Loew's Theatres and Paramount Pictures to erect the lobby display when it was learned that Gilbert's "Frontiersman" model was a facsimile of the film's train, the oldest railroad train existing in America, built in 1870.
